Strategic priorities on the ballot

On May 7, District 7 School Board members unanimously approved an August 20, 2024 bond referendum to fund two construction projects: A new Jesse Boyd Elementary School (to be located at the site of the former McCracken Middle School on Webber Road) and an 11,364 sq. ft. classroom addition to Mary H. Wright Elementary. The timing of the referendum enables both projects to have a targeted opening of August 2027.

The projects address two strategic priorities identified as critical to enabling District 7 to continue its longstanding tradition of delivering excellence for the Spartanburg community. The first is to fulfill the need for a new Jesse Boyd school facility that was identified nearly two decades ago. The second is to secure District 7's position as one of South Carolina's most desirable school district employers – and to combat the increasing teacher shortage at the local, state, and national levels – through innovative ways to recruit and retain high-quality teachers and staff. To accomplish the second strategic priority, District 7 would provide reduced-cost childcare for pre-K aged children of its employees, with site locations at the new Jesse Boyd Elementary and in the addition constructed at Mary H. Wright. The Mary H. Wright addition would also allow expansion of District 7's need-based 3K program for the public.

Shaping the future

Hall's summer project puts students at the forefront of AI research

Five Terriers have joined forces with Dr. Kimberly Hall this summer to discover how artificial intelligence can more effectively be incorporated in a college setting.

Susann Breazele '26, an English major from Pickens, South Carolina; Maggie Head '26, a chemistry and philosophy double major from Lexington, South Carolina; Kate Podrebarac '26, a computer science and applied mathematics double major from Friendswood, Texas; Sam Turnipseed '25, an English and philosophy major from Columbia, South Carolina; and Rivers West '25, an environmental studies major from Oak Ridge, North Carolina, signed up to take part in Hall's research project “Developing Undergraduate Humanistic AI Research Capacity at a Small Liberal Arts College.”

Hall, an associate professor of English who leads the college's AI Working Group, says current research focuses on how faculty and administrators view generative AI – a platform like ChatGPT for instance. She is making sure student perspectives are included.

Hall's collaboration with the student researchers will add depth to the AI Working Group's understanding of the issue that everyone is talking about these days.

“We are trying to think about what Wofford can offer students and how the college can prepare them for a generative AI future,” she says, “and to develop policies and training on campus to support students.”

For her project, Hall applied for and received a student-faculty research grant. Her team has spent the summer gathering data and information. They sent out campus surveys to gauge student perceptions

on AI, and they will follow up with interviews.

“We presented to the Gateway Scholars last week,” Breazele says. “Hearing incoming student perspectives was important to our understanding and for developing and implementing new guidelines on campus.”

Turnipseed's favorite part of the project has been the team's lively discussions, during which they share their ideas and opinions on the topic.

“This has been the most fascinating part of the research,” Turnipseed says. “It's interesting that even within our small group, everyone has their own ideas and opinions about AI.”

Hall says that in 2025 Wofford will join the AI Ready Network, a 12-month program sponsored by the Council of Independent Colleges. The program supports effective AI strategies.

Around South Carolina

Knockout Butchery breaks ground near Roebuck

Commissioner Hugh Weathers and other officials joined local farmers Travis and Misty Howard in breaking ground July 29 on a new beef processing facility that officials said will expand opportunities for South Carolina farmers and address the demand for local beef.

The Howards are building the new Knockout Butchery facility off Walnut Grove Road near Roebuck. The facility will support between seven and 10 new jobs and will have the capacity to process up to 35 head of cattle per week, according to the South Carolina Department of Agriculture (SCDA).

The Howards, who oper-

ate a facility in Pauline, say the new facility will quadruple their processing capacity. After the new facility opens, they plan to convert their existing facility to process pork and poultry. In addition to beef cuts, Knockout will offer custom smoked products like summer sausage, snack sticks, and jerky.

The Howards intend for the new plant to be a USDA-inspected facility, which mean products made there could be sold to both in-state and out-of-state customers.

“This facility is being built by farmers, for farmers,” Travis Howard said. “Our customer base has stood behind us for the past seven years and that



gave us the strength and trust to go forward with all of this.”

The Howards’ \$2.6 million investment is supported by a \$600,000 grant from the SCDA.

“More than 700 farmers in South Carolina raise beef, and the Knockout project will allow more of them to raise their animals to maturity and have them processed in the state, thus keeping more dollars in our economy,” Weathers said. “Travis and Misty are carving a bright future for agribusiness in South Carolina.”

A 2022 economic impact study commissioned by SCDA found that there is significant unmet demand for local agricultural products in South Carolina.

Officials said Covid-era supply chain disruptions also highlighted the need to decentralize meat processing.

Expanding small pro-

cessing in South Carolina will create more opportunities for small, in-state facilities to serve the state’s farmers and consumers, the officials said.

The new Knockout Butchery facility will incorporate a storefront as well as a venue for butchery and agriculture education.

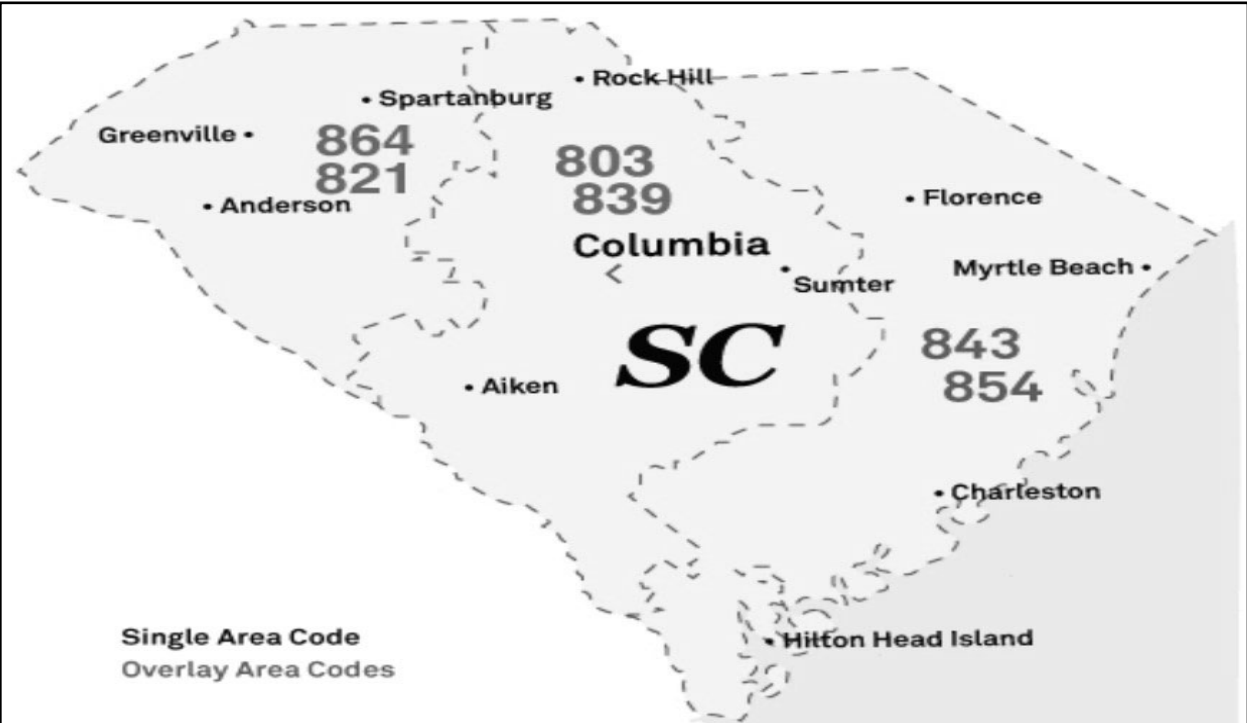
“Our goal is to keep the younger population interested in where their food comes from, and in farming and agriculture in general,” Misty Howard said. “We’re very excited for what the future holds for us, as well as the hard work we’re willing to put in to give the best service to our farmers and our customers.”

New 821 area code overlay and dialing procedures for Upstate are now underway

The Upstate region of South Carolina is receiving a new 821 area code that will supplement—but not replace—the current 864 area code. An overlay is the addition of another area code (821) to the same geographic region served by an existing area code (864). An overlay does not require customers to change their existing area code but does require customers to dial the area code to complete local calls.

The rollout of this area code will begin soon and, to prepare, 10-digit dialing will be introduced into the Upstate. The timeline follows:

- Beginning on July 19, 2024, all local calls made within the SC 864 area code must now be placed using 10 digits (area code + the 7-digit telephone number). Calls placed using just 7 digits will not be completed.
- Beginning August 19, 2024, new telephone lines or services may be assigned numbers using the new 821 area code.
- Your current telephone number, including current area code, won't change.
- If you seek new phone service on and after Aug. 19, 2024, you may be assigned a phone number with the 821 area code.
- You will need to dial the area code + telephone number for all local calls, including calls within the same area code.



- You will continue to dial 1 + area code + telephone number for all long-distance calls.
 - What is a local call now will remain a local call.
 - The price of a call, coverage area, or other rates and services won't change due to the overlay.
 - You can still dial just three digits to reach 911 and 988. You can also dial three digits to reach 211, 311, 511, and 811 where available.
- PSC officials urge you to identify your telephone number as a 10-digit number and include the area code when giving the number to friends, family, business associates, and customers, etc.
- Customers should ensure

all services, automatic dialing equipment, applications, software, or other types of equipment are reprogrammed to dial 10 digits if they are programmed to dial just 7 digits and to recognize the new 821 area code as a valid area code.

Examples include life-safety systems, fax machines, Internet dial-up numbers, gates, ankle monitors, speed dialers, mobile phone contact lists, call forwarding settings, voice-mail services, and similar functions.

Be sure to check your business stationery, advertising materials, personal checks, and your personal or pet ID tags to ensure the area code is included in

your telephone number. Important safety and security equipment, such as medical alert devices, and

alarm and security systems must be programmed to use 10-digit dialing. Many systems operate on 10-digit dialing by default, but some older equipment may still use 7 digits.

Contact your medical alert or security provider if you are not sure whether your equipment needs to be reprogrammed to accommodate the upcoming change to 10-digit local dialing.

Remember that all local calls must be programmed using 10 digits and add ‘1’ for all long-distance calls.

Plaintiff, Progressive Direct Insurance Company ("Progressive Direct"), seeks declaratory relief to determine the rights of the parties and alleges and shows as follows.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

1. Plaintiff Progressive Direct is an insurance company organized and existing pursuant to the laws of the State of Ohio, with its principal place of business in the State of Ohio. Plaintiff is authorized to transact business in the State of South Carolina, including writing and selling insurance policies.
2. Upon information and belief, Defendant George N. Heyward is a citizen and resident of Barnwell County, South Carolina.
3. Upon information and belief, Defendant Jemerica Daniels is a citizen and resident of Barnwell County, South Carolina.
4. Upon information and belief, Defendant Aaliyah Flowers is a citizen and resident of Barnwell County, South

5. This action is brought under the provisions of the Federal Declaratory Judgment Act, 28 U.S.C. § 2201 et seq. and Rule 57 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure; there is a real and justiciable controversy between the parties, and by these proceedings Plaintiff asks this court to inquire into and declare the rights and obligations of the parties arising out of the facts set forth below.

6. The amount in controversy exceeds seventy-five thousand and 00/100 (\$75,000.00) dollars, exclusive of interests and costs, and there is complete diversity of citizenship; therefore, this Court has jurisdiction to hear this matter under 28 U.S.C. § 1332(a) (1).

FACTS

8. Upon information and belief, Heyward is the grandfather of Daniels.

9. Daniels and Heyward do not reside in the same household.

10. On April 30, 2018, Progressive Direct issued an updated automobile insurance policy, Policy Number 35025935 (the "Policy"), to Heyward. (Exh. A; Progressive Direct Policy).

11. The declarations page reflects that the Policy is effective from January 14, 2018, through July 14, 2018, and insures two vehicles including a 2006 Toyota Corolla (the "Accident Vehicle"). (Exh. A).

12. According to the Policy: "Insured person" means:

a. you, a relative, or a rated resident with respect to an accident arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of an auto or a trailer;

b. any person with respect to an accident arising out of that person's use of a covered auto with the permission of you, a relative or a rated resident;

13. Daniels owns the Accident Vehicle.

14. Daniels maintains the Accident Vehicle.

15. Daniels pays for all expenses related to the Accident Vehicle, including reimbursing Heyward for the insurance premiums.

16. The Accident Vehicle is registered to Daniels.

17. The Accident Vehicle is primarily garaged at Daniels' residence.

18. Heyward derives no benefit from the Accident Vehicle and would suffer no loss from its destruction.

19. Daniels is not listed on the Policy as a relative or rated driver.

20. On May 12, 2018, Aaliyah Flowers was driving the Accident Vehicle down Legion Road, approaching Solomon Blatt Avenue, with Daniels riding as a passenger.

21. Flowers then entered the intersection, failing to yield the right of way to Cody Gleaton, operating his 2019 GMC Sierra.

23. Flowers was cited as contributing to the collision.

24. On May 6, 2021, Daniels filed a lawsuit against Flowers in the Barnwell County Court of Common Pleas, Civil Action No. 2021CP0600121 (the "Underlying Action").

25. In the Underlying Action, Daniels brought a cause of action alleging negligence against Flowers.

26. The Circuit Court entered default against Flowers on August 13, 2021, and referred the case to a Special Referee on July 12, 2022.

27. On September 8, 2023, the Special Referee entered judgment against Flowers in the amount of \$50,000.00 in actual damages and \$25,000.00 in punitive damages.

28. It appears that Daniels and Flowers have or will seek coverage under the Policy to satisfy this judgment.

FOR A FIRST DECLARATION

29. Plaintiff repeats and realleges each and every one of the allegations set forth above as if set forth verbatim below.

30. Progressive Direct would show that Heyward did not have an insurable interest in the Accident Vehicle at any time during the Policy's effective term.

31. Because Heyward did not have an insurable interest in the Accident Vehicle, any coverage afforded under the Policy for the Accident Vehicle, its operators, or its occupants is void.

32. Therefore, Plaintiff is entitled to a declaration that the Policy does not provide coverage for the May 12, 2018 loss.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests that this Court inquire into these matters and

declare that the Policy does not provide coverage for the May 12, 2018 loss, together with the costs of this action and such other and further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.

if your child turns 11 or 12 this year, it’s time to get the HPV vaccine, which protects against the HPV virus – a virus linked to six types of cancer.

Be conscientious about what your child eats at school. Healthy students are better learners. School meals should include fruits, vegeta-

bles, lean proteins, and whole grains. If you pack your child’s lunch and snacks, try to pack at least two-thirds of their meal with plant-based foods. Strive to include lean protein, or plant-based protein, and avoid processed meats and sugary drinks like soda and juice.

Be smart about sun-

screen. From gym class and school sports to recess and waiting for the school bus, kids of all ages spend a good portion of their day outside. It’s important to take steps to protect your child from damaging UV rays. Look for a broad spectrum sunscreen of at least SPF 30 and apply it before sending your kids to school. From 2022 to 2023, the number of middle school-aged children using tobacco products overall increased by nearly 50%, with e-cigarettes being the most commonly used product.

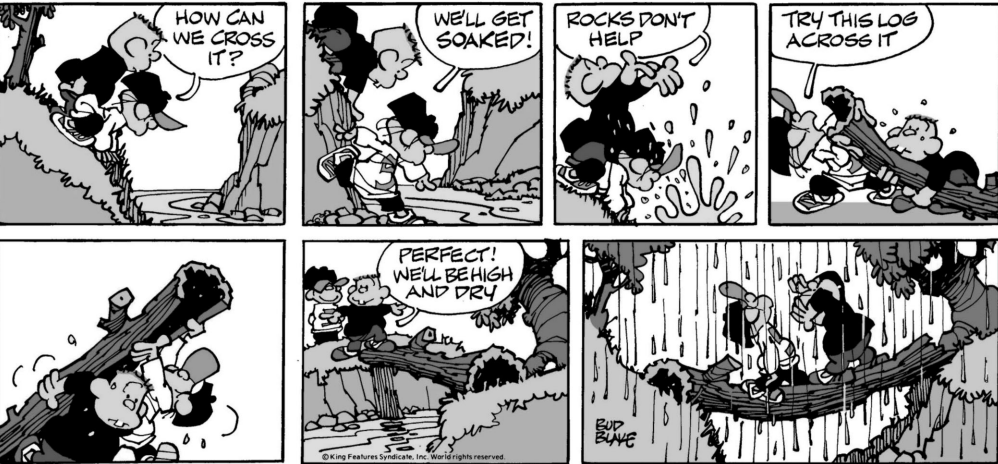

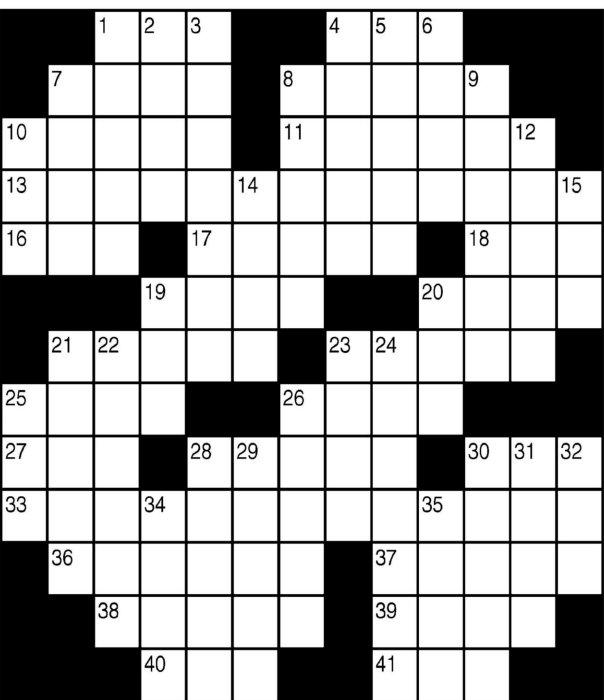
